JEWELRY

Seven suitcases and/or boxes were found scattered through the train, (marked V-1 to V-7 inclusive). They contain mostly envelopes or packages which are sealed with sealing wax and bear some name on the outside.

Some of these parcels had been opened while others remained untouched. They bore no numbers and were then given the above numbers.

V-1 - This case is separately covered in par 6 basic as well as on a separate inventory.

V-2 - It was a cardboard suitcase which had a large hole in the top and the bottom caused by corrosion. It had been wet. Contents were unpacked and repacked into a good leather suitcase in presence of Lt. Col. Haller, 1st Lt. Treese, 2nd Lt. Newman and Capt. Bach. The case was then tied and sealed in the presence of the above officers. Contents are jewelry, diamonds, rings, watches, etc. There was found lying near the hole on the bottom of this case one large diamond bracelet with many large stones. This was wrapped up and placed into the case.

V-3 - It is a wooden case of individually wrapped and sealed packages probably containing jewelry. Some of these appeared to have been tampered with.
